What do you do now?

I'm a glassblower and I also work as Operations Manager at a Fine Arts Company.

What are your major achievements since leaving Ballarat Grammar?

I've exhibited in shows throughout Australia and Internationally, including several solo shows and in Germany and the United States. I've been featured in Craft Arts International and shortlisted for the Western Australian Art Gallery's Tom Malone prize, Ranamok Glass prize, Deakin Contemporary Small Sculpture Prize and The Waterhouse Natural History Prize at the Museum of South Australia. I also recently demonstrated for an international conference.

Would you suggest studying an Art and Design subject in Year 12?

Definitely! Even if you don't intend to have a career in the arts, it really enriches your live and gives you a mental health outlet down the track!

Would you suggest the creative arts as a career?
